The Proposed New Amendments to Section 50 of the Planning Act and Their Effect on What You do Sidney H. Troister, LSM, Torkin Manes LLP

New amendments to section 50 of the Planning Act were introduced on April 15, 2021 and are likely to become law shortly. They will add new exceptions to the prohibitions in the act and will also impact procedures that you now follow in the decision making process. Sidney Troister is the author of "The law of Subdivision Control in Ontario" and has been a frequent speaker at OACA conferences. He was intimately involved in the introduction of these amendments with the hope that they will fix many of the traps in section 50 and help you make the process more user and consumer friendly.
